The Jamaicans asked for some help with goats in addition to raising grains and vegetables. I contacted Josiah to see if he wanted to come along and if he had any experience with goats. Yep, you guessed it- his family raised dairy goats for a number of vears!

The Jamaicans goat herd was just surviving, not flourishing. Josiah and his dad, Mark, observed the goats were infested with worms and not getting a balanced diet. They did a great job adjusting to what was available while teaching and encouraging the goat farmers.

Jamaica Update

We partnered with RAISE International while working in Jamaica. One of their farmers, Cleveland, had some beautiful straight rows with excellent spacing of sweet peppers. He also had a good supply of mulch. We emphasized the importance of inputs and he planted his last row with some goat manure.

Another lady showed me a picture of her and I from a year ago. It was taken on the last day of training. She said she had her best crop of sweet potatoes ever and was teaching Farming God's Way to her neighbors!
